The theory of the mosquito transmission of yellow fever was not placed on a scientific basis, however, until 19 years later, when a commission from the United States Army, headed by Maj. Walter Reed, completed its classical experiments in Cuba. The following year the commission expressed its conclusions in 11 postulates as follows: 1. The mosquito, *Culex fasciatus*, serves as the intermediate host for the parasite of yellow fever. 2. Yellow fever is transmitted to the nonimmune individual by the bite of the mosquito that has previously fed on the blood of those sick with this disease. 3. An interval of about 13 days or more after contamination appears to be necessary before the mosquito is capable of conveying the infection. 4. The bite of the...
