In the standard account of early Christianity, a multitude of sects were founded in the first centuries after Jesus's death, each with their own gospels many possessing daring and even bizarre ideas which were suppressed in the 4th or 5th centuries as the Church canonized the gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. Religious historian Philip Jenkins here reveals that in fact, dozens of alternative gospels not only survived but in many cases remained influential texts within the Church, while new gospels continued to be written and accepted. For a thousand years, these stories about the life and death of Jesus were approved for liturgical reading, read by ordinary laypeople for instruction and pleasure, and cited as authoritative by scholars and theologians. It was only with the Reformation and Counter-Reformation, Jenkins explains, that the Lost Gospels were effectively driven from churches. Even so, many survived, and some continue to shape Christian practice and belief in our own day. "Be prepared to be shocked and/or delighted.
